BRANCH ACTIVITIES: Members will be interested to hear that Mr. R.H.N. Smithers, Director of the National Museum, and Major I.R. Grimwood of the N.R. Game and Tsetse Department were in charge of the Ornithological section of the 1952 Carp edition, of the many interesting results so far learnt, space only permits here to mention two new records for the Territory in the Tit Babbler, *Parisoma subcaeruleum cinerascens* and the Greater Glossy Starling, *Lamprotornis australis*. The expedition proceeded west from Nangweshi to the Mashi River area a distance of some 100 miles. Dug-out canoes were employed to explore the Mashi Swamp area in search of Swamp Warblers. The final results from the expedition will be learnt later.

RINGING. I have a note from Dr. Ashton who does so much in organising the ringing scheme throughout South Africa. Our participation is growing; 56 species ringed by S.R. members and 35 by Northern Rhodesian members in 1951. This year many more have been banded.
