Photographs were obtained by W.T. Miller, and other useful data was obtained. Ringing however proved too difficult, the nests being inaccessible. A specimen of a Honeyguide was obtained by D. Plowes for research in connection with Dr Friedman's studies in the family of Indicatoridae. Co-operation in this work is also being undertaken by the Swiss Scientist and member of our branch, Dr. Buttiker, in Salisbury. Messrs Irwin and Edwards have both contributed specimens for this research.
